



The REAL Philly Experience:

Trolley Tour & Cheesesteaks

Tuesday, March 13, 2012

After a full first day at the Navigation Workshop, join your fellow workshop attendees for a relaxed evening exploring the “real” Philadelphia. Our trolley will pick us up at the Marriott Airport Hotel at 6:30 p.m. for a 3-hour tour of Philadelphia. We will drive past the Delaware waterfront and port facilities, stop for a dinner of cheesesteaks (or pizza) in South Philly, drive past the historic area (including Independence Hall and the Liberty Bell), drive past City Hall and stop at the Philadelphia Art Museum for a Rocky run up the steps and a beautiful view of the city, drive along East & West River Drives with a view of Boathouse Row along the Schuylkill River, and end back at the hotel at 9:30 p.m.

We will make a stop in South Philly where we will have the opportunity to order “ultimate” Philly cheesesteaks for dinner. Now, there are *cheesesteaks*, and then there are *cheesesteaks*. Whose are better – Pat’s or Geno’s??? YOU decide. Perhaps you’ll partner with someone and get one from each place so you can share and compare!

How to Order a Philly Cheesesteak:

When ordering a cheesesteak, the idea is to let the cashier know (a) that you would like a cheesesteak, (b) what type of cheese you want, and (c) whether or not you want fried onions. You have to be as concise as possible while doing so. Locals have it down to three words. Saying “one wiz with” to the person behind the counter means you would like one cheesesteak (denoted by the “one”) with Cheese Whiz as your choice of cheese (denoted by the “wiz”) and with fried onions (denoted by the “with”). In contrast, “one provolone without” would get you a single cheesesteak (one) made with provolone cheese (provolone) and without fried onions (without). Ok, got it? Know what you want to order while you’re waiting in line because if you’re not ready, you may be sent back to the end of the line. ☺

Price per person: \$20 for the trolley tour (cash only), includes soft drinks, water, and snacks. Adult beverages will be available on the trolley for purchase by separate contribution. For dinner, the cost of the cheesesteaks (or pizza) is on your own.
