

Dr. Pamela Bailey is a Research Botanist and a Landscape Architect at the Environmental Laboratory, U.S. Army Engineer Research and Development Center. She combines both professions into ecosystem restoration projects using native plant communities for both military and civil applications. Areas of project work and research includes design and construction techniques using native plants, conducting botanical surveys, monitoring native plant communities, riparian corridor re-vegetation, lake shore stabilization, prairie restoration, and pollination biology. She is currently working on a project examining soil and plant community dynamics for the purpose of restoration on abandoned coal mine lands on several Corps Lakes. She obtained a PhD degree from the University of Guelph, in Canada, with a focus on pollination networks examining insect visitors of a rare, endemic *Erigeron* species compared to two more common *Erigeron* species.
